

History of Revenue Growth & Allocation (Graph A)



For the year ending December 31, 2023, Orphan's Lifeline International experienced a decrease in revenues of 13.6%. Large, one-time donations were significantly down, while monthly donations were up, primarily in relation to our sponsorship program. Special needs and project motivated revenues were similar to last year, with many special projects being funded as well as a new record number of young adults attending college and the associated donations for those students.


We anticipate growth to be flat to modest, considering it is an election year and inflation remains high and the economy uncertain.

Donor retention remained at approximately 98%. There were more new donors is 2023 than in the year prior, with a growth of 14.6%.

Special needs requests were similar in cost to the year prior and all requests were met and funds were passed through at 100% to each designated need. Special needs and projects totaled more than \$236,921 this year! This falls outside of the daily care of thousands of orphans in our programs.



2023 was a year in which once again, many special needs were fulfilled. Here are the highlights:

Acts of Charity – We took a break on building homes as the crews were needed to complete the Coulter McCall School. This school is a much-needed asset for this impoverished, rural community. We also had multiple restrooms to complete for the houses already built.

Safe Home – The final phases of the Dave Board Memorial Trade School were completed. All that remains are furnishing and equipment needs and the school can open. Safe Home also received funds for several students to continue their college educations.

Amazing Grace - The final touches were put on the newly rebuilt facility.

BMS – Blankets and facility repairs were provided

Butiki, Freshfire, Life of Favor, Home of Champions, Nantale, Safe Home, Hope Family Children's Home, Learning Estate, Peter's Memorial, Errabalem Boys Home, Rose of Sharon, CCIM – All of these homes received educational grants for children entering college as well as for uniforms, school supplies, attendance to private schools and for tutors. Education is a critical part of our programs and key to breaking the cycle of poverty and the culture that creates orphans in the first place. This year's costs exceeded those of 2022 as we sent more than \$115,000 in grants to cover the educational needs for these homes.

Russia – The country itself continued to be a special need due to the war with Ukraine. As always, the most innocent suffer in these situations as the government prioritizes war over the needs of the orphans.

All of the homes received grants to have a Christmas Celebration and purchase gifts for the children.

Planning Forward 2024


As always, thousands of children were cared for in all of these Orphan's Lifeline Funded Children's Homes every day in 9 countries. They were provided with food, clothing, medical care, education and spiritual instruction every day. Children graduated from the homes and moved on to jobs or continuing higher education. New children were taken off the streets and are being given the same life-saving and life-changing opportunities as their predecessors.


2024 will see the continuation of Orphan's Life-line's current programs as well as the expansion of our new Orphan and Widow program in Kenya and now India as well, with a focus on families with girls in them. We were unable to purchase land for our planned new girl's home in India, so we are planning to more than double the aforementioned orphan/widow program for girls. This is a critical need as uneducated and uncared for females are subject to trafficking, abuse and even in general, poor treatment within their culture.


The Coulter McCall School will open and provide education to orphans who would otherwise have no chance at breaking the cycle. Many of the children who will attend, are the younger orphans we are currently caring for whether through our Orphan/Widow Program there or our community Orphan Care Program. The Dave Board Memorial Trade Center in Liberia will also begin operations and provide a much-needed alternative to college for students who don't qualify academically.


We will resume building houses for Orphans/Widows in Kenya as well and seek sponsorships for these desperate, fatherless families.
